The 2011-2012 school year started with a lively event! The AAMC-ASR Welcome Freshwomen, Transfer Students, and Graduate Students event, "Taco Tuesday," was held on Tuesday, August 23rd. Once again, this event was the most successful welcome event for the students since the ASR committee started this late day affair nine years ago. Bon Appetite catered the event, and the College picked up the majority of the cost. Tacos were truly the theme as Alexandra Wong, Associate Director of Alumnae Relations, directed catering to replicate a Taco Truck theme for all the guests. The event was split between two locations: the dinner and formal program were held outside on the Art Museum lawn while desert and prizes were in Reinhardt Alumnae House. At the formal program, Senior Director of Alumnae Relations and Annual Giving Laura Gobbi welcomed attendees and introduced the AAMC president Linda Jaquez-Fissori who then introduced the new President of Mills College, Alecia A. DeCourdreaux. Students who attended the dessert and raffle drawing had a chance to win Mills Swag such as t-shirts, mugs, and gift certificates to the Mills College Bookstore supplied by Alumnae Relations.
