## 2014-15 Highlight Look-Back:

- <u>Holiday Teas</u>: The committee encouraged members of the Board of Governors to attend branch and club holiday teas held in California. At least one and in some cases two or three governors attended each of the teas: Palo Alto, East Bay Branch, San Francisco, Orange County, and Marin. In addition, each of our non-Board committee members attended a tea. Thanks to all!
- Local leader networking lunch: The Committee collaborated with Caitlin McGarty on a local leader networking lunch, held on Saturday, February 28 at Reinhardt House. Representatives attended from North Bay, Marin, Palo Alto, and East Bay. The agenda was designed to facilitate information sharing and dialogue: events that really worked and why they were successful; events that were less successful and possible reasons why; suggestions for future volunteer training. Marge Nicholson shared about the work of the Committee.

- <u>Annual Meeting</u>: The Annual Meeting, held on May 16, once again celebrated the work of our branches and clubs. Representatives from seven of our clubs and branches were present at the meeting and gave verbal highlights of their program years. An additional three clubs submitted written reports.
- <u>\$50 expense reimbursements for branch-club activities</u>: Two clubs took advantage of our \$50 expense reimbursement offer, North Bay and Orange County.

- In light of recent restructuring of OIA staffing, partner with the College and alumnae on effective ways to engage alumnae in support of the College.
- Dialogue with branch/club contacts to identify their greatest needs and how we mightbe a resource. e.g.
  - i. Finding effective ways to engage alumnae, especially younger alumnae
  - ii. Reaching out to students
  - iii. Funding activities and finding new ways to do fund-raising
  - iv. Supporting career networking
- Continue conversation about how best to use our budget to support clubs and branches.
- Partner with Nominations Committee and Alumnae Awards Committee to involve branch and club members in making nominations for alumna trustee, members of the BOG and alumna awards; also encourage voting for alumna trustee.
- Continue to encourage BOG members to visit branches and clubs.
