In the early 20th century, industrialist and philanthropist Andrew Carnegie funded hundreds
of libraries throughout the United States as well as in other locations around the world.
Several of these libraries were built in Alameda County and are still in use today. Locally,
Carnegie funded four of Oakland's public libraries: the African American Museum & Library
at Oakland (formerly called the Charles Greene Library and now known as AAMLO), and the
Golden Gate, Temescal and Melrose branches. He also funded the Julia Morgan-designed
Margaret Carnegie Library on the Mills College campus. Carnegie's generosity gave the
public the opportunity to freely access the world of knowledge and learning. April 2019
marks the centennial of Carnegie's death.
